Harmonious Marriage

Romans 15:5-7

May the God who gives the power of patient endurance (steadfastness) and who supplies encouragement, grant _____ and I to live in such mutual harmony and such full sympathy with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, that together we may with united hearts and one voice, praise and glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ – and that we will welcome and receive to our hearts one another, even as Christ welcomed and received us for the glory of God.

Colossians 2:2

I pray that _____ and my heart may be braced, comforted, cheered and encouraged. As we are knit together in love, that we may come to have all the abounding wealth and blessings of assured conviction of understanding, and that we may become progressively more intimately acquainted with and may know more definitely and accurately and thoroughly (that mystic secret of God which is Christ), the anointed one.

Philippians 1:27

I pray that _____ and I may stand firm in united spirit and purpose striving side-by-side and contending with a single mind of the faith of the glad tidings (the Gospel).

Proverbs 5:15-19

Father, I pray and believe that _____ and I will drink waters out of our cistern of pure marriage relationship and fresh running waters out of our own well; that _____ will confine himself/herself to me alone and not from strangers with us, that our foundation of human life will be blessed with the rewards of fidelity and that we will rejoice with each other. I pray that I will be as a loving deer, tender, gentle, attractive, and my bosom shall satisfy _____ at all times, and he/she will always be intoxicated with my love.

Ephesians 5:33

I pray and believe that _____ will love me as his wife as being in a sense his very own self, and that I do respect and reverence my husband – that I notice him, regard him, honor him, prefer him, venerate and esteem him; that I will defer (yield to one’s guidance) him, praise him, love and admire _____ exceedingly.

1 Corinthians 13:4-8

I pray and believe Father, that our love will endure long, will be patient and kind, our love will never be envious or boil over with jealousy – it will not be vainglorious and will not display itself haughtily. May our love not be conceited, arrogant, or inflated with pride; not rude or unmannerly and not act unbecomingly. God's love is in us and I pray we will not be self-seeking, touchy, fretful, or resentful. Taking no account or paying attention to a suffered wrong. I pray we would not rejoice at injustice but rejoice when right and truth prevail. May our love bear up under anything and everything that comes, and be ever ready to believe the best of each other having hopes that are fadeless and enduring without weakening. Because love never fails, I pray that God's love in us will never fade out, or come to an end.
